# Pioneering research wins international funding

Dr Olivia McCarthy has won a £67,000 (600.000 kr) grant from the Danish Diabetes Association to carry on investigating the latest artificial pancreas technology in people with type 1 diabetes who are performing exercise.

An artificial pancreas is a man-made device that is designed to release insulin in response to changing blood glucose levels in a similar way to a human pancreas.

### SUNRISE in India

The first solar-powered demonstrator building in the village of Khuded in Maharahstra, India is under construction.

The building which was designed and created in close collaboration with <u>SPECIFIC</u>, in line with their <u>Active Building concept</u> will use solar power to generate and store clean, reliable, off-grid electricity to be shared by the community. The structure will be equipped with technologies for lighting, clean water, sanitation, agricultural activities, and power points for residents to charge batteries (such as for phones and lamps), thus reducing the need to burn fuels.

### The UK Vertical Lift Network

Swansea University has successfully become a member of the UK Vertical Lift Network which is a collaboration between UK academia and industry, providing leadership and promotion of the UK rotorcraft and rotor-powered vehicles, consisting of universities, national aerospace institutions and industrial research bodies.

The UKVLN allows data and software sharing amongst members and provides additional industry collaboration opportunities with Leonardo Helicopter, Vertical Aerospace, GKN Aerospace, Sophrodyne Aerospace, DSTL, and Aircraft Research Association Ltd (ARA).

Using this network, Swansea University can promote its aerospace research, especially in the rotorcraft and novel air mobility vehicle aspects.
