Academic shortlisted for the University Engineering Staff Member of the Year

Congratulations to <u>Dr Jennifer Thompson</u>, who has been shortlisted for the University Engineering Staff Member of the Year, in the <u>Engineering Talent Awards 2024</u>, for her outstanding work as PI for the <u>50% for the Future</u> project.

Jennifer's continued dedication to the project, alongside her existing roles as Mechanical Engineering Senior Lecturer, Admissions Tutor and SACEME ED&I Lead, has resulted in this well-deserved recognition.

The 50% for the Future project, is a longitudinal study focussed on developing an iterative, collaborative process to improve representation and experience of females studying Mechanical Engineering at Higher Education level





Academic receives the Murchison Award

Congratulations to <u>Professor Stefan Doerr</u>, Department of Geography, for being awarded the prestigious Murchison Award for pioneering research influencing policy and management of environmental risks from wildfires.

The award from the <u>Royal Geographical Society</u> with IBG (Institute of British Geographers) is in acknowledgement of Stefan's outstanding contribution to geographical sciences with particular impact in the fields of geomorphology, hydrology, soil and wildfire science.

Stefan said: "I'm thrilled to receive this award on behalf of the whole wildfire community and especially <u>Cristina Santin</u> who co-wrote the key paper leading to it."



Scientific Advisor for the European Outdoor Conservation Association nomination

Associate Professor Nicole Esteban, Department of Biosciences, was recently nominated as a Scientific Advisor for the European Outdoor Conservation Association (EOCA), as one of their six advisors, providing input to selection of conservation projects related to the coastal and marine environment.

EOCA is a charity set up in 2006 to enable companies from the outdoor sector to work collectively together and support conservation work. EOCA supports and funds grassroots conservation, protection and regeneration projects around the world, protecting the wild places and wildlife. Funded projects aim to tackle the loss of biodiversity, mitigate against climate change, be beneficial to local communities and leave a lasting, positive legacy.



Young People's Book Prize 2024 - Shortlisting panel invitation

<u>Dr Emrys Evans</u>, Department of Chemistry, was recently invited to become a panellist for the <u>Royal Society</u> <u>Young People's Book Prize</u>.

The Young People's Book Prize aims to promote literacy in young people and inspire them to read about science. It also supports the writing of excellent, accessible STEM books for under-14s. Each year, the winner is selected by judging panels made up of thousands of young people at schools across the UK from a shortlist selected by an adult panel.

The other panel members include a Fellowship of the Royal Society, a head teacher, a children's TV presenter and a writer.


Swansea NanoMaterials Lab 7th year celebration

The <u>Swansea NanoMaterials Lab</u>, is celebrating its 7th year and a new name - the NanoMaterials Lab: Manufacturing with Atoms.

The Swansea University Nanomaterials Lab was established on 1 June 2017 to connect the fundamental science of materials on the sub-10 nanometre scale to the full spectrum of technological applications.

To date, the lab's output includes 81 publications (plus 17 in preparation), 3 new patents, the formation of two new spin-off companies, Nium and Grove, and established two "satellite" labs – Harwell and Universite Sorbonne Paris Nord.





Funding success for green printed electronics

Following the completion of the <u>ICURe Explore program</u>, and a recommendation from an expert business panel, the creation of a spinout company was deemed the best route to commercialisation of the innovative reusable silver ink developed by researchers at Swansea.

The team, led by <u>Dr James Claypole</u>, Department of Mechanical Engineering, went on to complete the 3 month ICURe Exploit training program and was invited to submit an application for the Innovate UK follow on grant to support the creation of the spinout company.

Following a highly competitive Innovate UK application process, a grant of £250k was award to the team to establish "Ail Arain', the spinout company to exploit this technology.

James currently holds a Research Wales Impact Fellowship.



Visiting Professor receives prestigious prize

Professor Thuc-Quyen Nguyen from University of California Santa Barbara (UCSB) recently visited the Department of Chemistry where she was presented with a prestigious award. The 2023 de Gennes prize from the Royal Society of Chemistry, was awarded for her 'seminal contributions to the development of organic semiconducting materials and device physics of organic photovoltaics to mitigate climate change'.

Thuc-Quyen talked about the work that has led to this prestigious prize, but also covered her humble upbringing in a Vietnamese village and how she has set up a foundation to support people in similar villages.

During the visit, Thuc-Quyen was keen to meet with ECRs and PGRs and coach them a little on career paths in academia.

The event took place as part of the Postgraduate Research (PGR) Festival, a month-long series of events showcasing the cutting-edge research conducted by Swansea University students.
