
More than 130 participants from twenty countries, representing sixty-six local and international organisations, took part in the event, which was called the New IPM Symposium 2022.

## Giant trees of the Amazon

<u>Dr Jackie Rosette</u>, Royal Society Research Fellow, (Geography) was recently interviewed by the BBC World Service Newshour about her follow-up expedition to the Amazonian rainforest where her team successfully reached the tallest of the trees which were discovered through lidar data analysis.

This was a challenging expedition for the team, working in extreme and remote conditions. The trek consisted of 4 days by boat along the River Jari and a further 2 days by foot through the forest to reach the tree.

These giant trees represent a new discovery of trees in excess of 80m tall which were not known to exist previously in the Amazon Forest.
