Geography PhD student Aaron Todd recently presented a talk at the <u>International Mine Water Association</u> <u>Conference</u> in Christchurch, New Zealand, on his research at the abandoned Nantymwyn lead mine and the sources of metal pollution.

Aaron's presentation won first prize with the award including €1500, plus honorary membership of IMWA. The joining paper, "Using Tracer Injection and Synoptic Sampling, and Salt Dilution Flow to Gauge Metal Fluxes in a Temperate Watershed", will be published later this year.

Mathematics paper published

<u>Dr Grigory Garkusha</u> from Mathematics Department has recently had the paper "Semilocal Milnor K-theory" published in the International Mathematics Research Noticies journal. This is a top journal publishing papers of outstanding quality. The paper computes important motivic cohomology and K-theory groups and gives several criteria for the longstanding Beilinson-Soule Vanishing Conjecture and Beilinson-Parshin's Conjectures.

Academic awarded an EPSRC Fellowship

Dr Miles Morgan from he Welsh Centre for printing and Coating (WCPC), has been awarded a prestigious 3-year EPSRC Fellowship by the National Fellowship in Fluid Dynamics (NFFDy). The fellowship is aligned with the epsrc UK Fluids Network and involves partners at University of Oxford, UCL, the PoreLab Centre of Excellence at University of Oslo and the Complex Flow Lab at Swansea.

A joint UK-Korean workshop entitled Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning for Fundamental Science, recently took 11 researchers associated to the UKRI Centre for Doctoral Training in Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning and Advanced Computing (AIMLAC), to Seoul, for a week-long exchange on research in and

The Highly Cited Researchers 2022 list, from Clarivate, has recognised Swansea University researchers who demonstrated significant influence in their chosen field or fields through the publication of multiple highly cited papers during the last decade.

The researchers on the list this year include <u>Emeritus</u> <u>Professor Nidal Hilal</u>, Engineering, and <u>Dr Shuai Li</u>, Mechanical Engineering.

The Highly Cited Researchers[™] 2022 list uses both quantitative and qualitative analysis to identify individuals from across the globe who have demonstrated significant and broad influence in their chosen field or fields of research.

ASTUTE 2020+ contributes £541 million to the Welsh economy

The ASTUTE 2020+ project which has generated an impressive £541 million contribution to the Welsh economy through Industry-Academia Collaboration in the Manufacturing Sector, will be replaced with a new ASTUTE Centre of Excellence.

Funded by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) through the Welsh Government and participating industrial partners and Higher Education Institutions, ASTUTE 2020+ provided support to over 540 Welsh enterprises, and created and safeguarded over 1020 jobs across Wales since its inception in 2010.

<u>Professor Johann Sienz</u>, ASTUTE 2020+ Operation Director, said:

"Collaborative working via industry-academia partnerships has not only seen the development and delivery of many vital and valuable projects, but also the formation of key relationships that will continue to thrive and flourish for the benefit of the Welsh region beyond the scope of the ASTUTE 2020+ operation."
