Tuition fees are determined by your year of study, the type of course you are undertaking and your country of domicile.



FUNDING

There are now more ways than ever to fund your postgraduate studies. As well as the scholarships and bursaries that Swansea University provides, postgraduate funding is available from numerous organisations, including the Student Loans Company, research councils, industry and charities. Many postgraduate students fund their studies through 'portfolio funding', in which they gather funds from a variety of sources. Examples of the types of funding available include:

POSTGRADUATE GOVERNMENT FUNDING

Postgraduate government funding is available to all UK and eligible EU domiciled students (with settled or pre-settled status) studying master's and PhD level courses at a UK university. INTERNATIONAL ALUMNI POSTGRADUATE BURSARY SCHEME

International students who have successfully completed an undergraduate or postgraduate taught degree at Swansea University will be considered for a bursary (dependent on subject area) towards postgraduate tuition fees. The scheme is open to eligible candidates applying for a taught or research degree at Swansea University.


SUPPORT FOR CARE LEAVERS

MEET SIMON AND MATTHEW, TWO MECHANICAL ENGINEERING POSTGRADUATES WHO TURNED THEIR RESEARCH INTO A START-UP

Air View Engineering was created by two Swansea University postgraduate students, with the goal of tackling the climate crisis. Their innovative CO₂ capture technology is the product of three years of innovation and development, designed to be scalable, modular, and rapidly deployable. With consistent support from the Swansea University Enterprise Team and over half a million pounds in grants, they have begun developing their first pilot facility. Resilience is key, but with a good idea, nothing should stop you from achieving your goals. Air View Engineering is proof that knowledge from your postgraduate degree can be applied to real-world problems to make a meaningful impact.



Our courses include vital research and methodology skills, along with tailored departmental training to prepare you for advanced academic and professional pursuits.

Specialised training opportunities throughout the year enrich your learning experience. Additionally, you can achieve a Postgraduate Diploma with 120 credits or a Postgraduate Certificate with 60 credits

If you're a current Swansea student in your final year of undergraduate study, you could apply for a master's degree via Fast-track*. Here are a few key benefits of applying through Fast-track:

- You won't have to submit references, academic transcripts or a personal statement
- Your application will be prioritised
- You'll receive a decision within 48 working hours

CONVERSION COURSES

If you want to change the direction of your studies or career path, you have the option as a postgraduate student to move away from the area you studied at undergraduate level by studying a conversion course. These courses allow graduates of any subject area to study a postgraduate master's course without any previous relevant qualifications.

We have a diverse selection of conversion courses available in finance, science, engineering, health science, medicine, law, business management, and arts and humanities.





CAN I STUDY PART-TIME?

Master's, Postgraduate Diplomas and Postgraduate Certificates can normally be studied on a full-time or part-time basis in a wide variety of subject areas. You are encouraged to contact the academic department in question before applying.

APPLYING FOR A RESEARCH DEGREE

There are two main routes to applying for a postgraduate research programme:

PREDESIGNED PROJECTS AND STUDENTSHIPS

A predesigned project will often be part of wider research being undertaken by an academic or research group. These types of projects will usually have a defined title, fixed aims and objectives, and you'll normally be supervised by the academic that designed the project. Swansea University advertises a large number of these opportunities throughout the academic year in all subject areas. All available projects are advertised on our research scholarships webpages or on our self-funded PhDs page, with new opportunities added frequently.

SELF-DESIGNED PROJECTS

A self-designed PhD will take a little more effort and thought to get started, but you should ultimately end up with a project theme that truly excites and interests you. After coming up with an initial idea for a project, you will need to identify an appropriate academic supervisor. A good starting point is to find the University department with the areas of strength that are most relevant to your research. You can also search Swansea's directory of expertise to find an academic with research interests close to your own.



- You'll still be able to access the extensive range of services offered by departments such as the Careers and Employability team, Centre for Academic Success and HWB.
- 4. You may already know several of your postgraduate coursemates, and you may even be able to continue living with former flatmates.
- 5. Swansea's range of conversion courses allow you to study for your postgraduate degree in a completely new subject area.
- If you choose to study in the same subject area, you can continue to build on your working relationship with academic lecturers and mentors, further developing your specialist knowledge.
- 7. As a current Swansea student, you'll complete a much shorter application form for your chosen master's* course via Fast-track.

I chose to complete my master's degree at Swansea University because of the wonderful experience I had during my undergrad here. A key factor in my decision was Swansea's dedication to student employability. The biggest difference between my undergraduate and postgraduate experiences is the higher level of difficulty. However, Swansea provides ample support from lecturers, supervisors, and library staff, ensuring you feel supported. My advice for undergraduates considering staying for their postgraduate studies is to attend a postgraduate open day to learn more about the courses and opportunities available.

Medicine Graduate

Entry Medicine because of my excellent experience in my first undergraduate degree here. Swansea offers Graduate Entry Medicine, rather than undergraduate Medicine, which allows you to meet people from all walks of life, who all bring a unique set of skills to the table. Swansea's course also has an excellent reputation, including the spiral curriculum, early clinical exposure and welfare support. There is such a welcoming, friendly atmosphere around the campuses, between staff and students alike. It is diverse and vibrant university, meaning that Swansea can serve as a home from home for anyone and everyone.

PhD Physics graduate

stayed in Swansea for a PhD in an antimatter lab. I secured a bursary to fund my studies and worked as a Postgraduate Demonstrator for teaching experience and additional funds. Being a postgraduate researcher required more time commitment than my undergraduate studies and prepared me for full-time employment.



The College **V** Coleq

A postgraduate pathway is known as a Pre-Master's. These are designed to bridge the gap between your academic qualifications and Swansea University's master's level entry requirements.

The College, Swansea University specialises in developing and delivering pre-master's programmes which progress into a number of Swansea University master's. From day one with us, you will be fully integrated into life at Swansea University as our dedicated academic building is found on the Bay Campus.

The postgraduate pathway is designed for students who:

- Require additional English language training
- Come from an academic background different to that of the UK and do not meet university direct-entry requirements
- Have been away from studies for a period of time
- Are looking to fine-tune skills already gained during their undergraduate studies or employment

The language of instruction at The College, Swansea University is English. To attain entry into the postgraduate pathway you must be able to demonstrate you have a suitable level of English proficiency. For further details, contact our team:

If you do not meet the English language requirement for direct entry to your chosen pathway, you can receive the required amount of English language tuition to prepare you for successful entry at a later date. English Language training is delivered by the University's English Language Training Services (ELTS) with multiple entry points throughout each year.

PRE-MASTER'S

This is stage one of the postgraduate pathway. It is one, two or three semesters long, depending on your chosen pathway and qualifications (English language and academic) at the point of entry. This programme is available in the areas of: languages, politics and culture, engineering, children and young people, management, accounting and finance, and computer science.

The pre-master's programme allows you to adjust to the rigorous research and independent study requirements of a postgraduate degree.

The Pre-Master's programme will:

- Help you develop fundamental knowledge and an understanding of the basic principles relevant to your particular degree
- Help you develop numerical techniques, research methodologies and ICT, presentation and communication skills
- Help you develop your intellectual and practical skills building to a set of transferable skills that will support you in your onward academic studies, careers and decision-making
- Ensure you have attained the prescribed level of interdisciplinary language competence

MASTER'S

The master's degree is stage two of the postgraduate pathway, and is taught by Swansea University.

APPLICATION PROCESS

You can apply via our Learner Gateway portal for for most of our taught and research courses:



When we receive your application, we will:

- Make sure that you meet our entry requirements
- Check that you have the experience and skills necessary to study the subject
- Look for evidence of your achievements, commitment and motivation

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DO YOU NEED?

To study a postgraduate course at Swansea you will normally need an appropriate honours degree or postgraduate qualification. Relevant work experience can be taken into consideration for entry to some of our taught courses. Please see the course listings for detailed entry requirements.

When submitting an application, don't forget to include:

- Copies of your academic transcripts to date
- A copy of your degree certificate (if awarded)
- An approved English Language qualification (if required)
- Your research proposal (for research degree applications)
- Your full CV
- Personal statement

Some courses require candidates to provide additional written work to support an application.

Once we have received your application and supporting documents, we try to make a decision (or issue an invitation for interview) within 5 working days for taught applications and 15 working days for research applications.

YOUR APPLICATION DECISION Once we have considered your application,

you will receive an email advising you to log into your Learner Gateway portal to view one of the following decisions:

- a conditional or unconditional offer of a place
- an invite for interview
- a notification advising you we are unable to offer you a place

Offer letters are always made by the University's Admissions Office, on behalf of the relevant academic department. Our terms and conditions of offer will be attached.

If you have a disability, medical condition, or a specific learning difficulty, you will be invited to contact the University's Disability Office or Wellbeing Service so we can be sure that we are able to give you the support you need throughout your studies.

DATES AND DEADLINES

All departments have closing dates for their courses. We recommend that you submit your applications as early as possible to allow yourself time to make necessary arrangements. Please take note of scholarship deadlines as many of our scholarships and bursaries have closing dates earlier than the application deadline dates. Please visit our website:



Applying

FOR A PHD?

You can start your PhD at Swansea University in October, January, April or July. Give yourself 3 to 6 months to plan and research before submitting your application.

At Swansea, we offer two main types of PhD project:

- Those that are predesigned by an academic (more common in science and engineering subjects)
- Those that you design yourself



Predesigned project:

A predesigned project will often be part of wider research being undertaken by an academic or research group. These usually have a defined title, fixed aims and objectives, and you'll normally be supervised by the academic that designed the project. Swansea University advertises a large number of these opportunities throughout the academic year in all subject areas.

FUNDING:

Research scholarships at Swansea University usually provide funding for the duration of your studies.

There are also PhD loans available through Student Finance England and Student Finance Wales.

APPLICATION:

Applying is straightforward – you'll just need to follow the instructions on the project advertisement.

These will usually have a specific application deadline so allow yourself plenty of time to complete any paperwork and gather references if required.

Self-designed project:

A self-designed PhD will take a little more effort and thought to get started, but you should ultimately end up with a project theme that truly excites and interests you.

CONTACT POTENTIAL SUPERVISORS:

After coming up with an initial idea for a project, you will need to identify and contact an appropriate academic supervisor.

A good starting point is to find the University department with the areas of strength that are most relevant to your research. You can use Swansea University's online directory of expertise, speak to your current supervisor, attend a study fair or a postgraduate open day.

FUNDING:

There are various ways to fund your PhD, including loans, available through Student Finance Wales and Student Finance England.



APPLICATION:

Once you have identified a potential supervisor for your own research idea, you'll need to contact them prior to submitting a formal application. Academics welcome informal approaches from prospective students and they will also be able to help shape your research proposal. Do your research before you submit and take your time preparing.
