Atomic fountain clock aims to solve the mysteries of antimatter

Swansea PhD students, **Ted Thorpe-Woods** and **Joos Schoonwater**, Department of Physics, have been involved in a Swansea led project to create a device capable of producing a fountain of caesium atoms at CERN. These atoms can measure the frequency of light absorbed by antimatter and are vital to understanding the extent of the symmetry between matter and antimatter, a big question at the heart of how the Universe works.

The caesium fountain was designed and built at the National Physical Laboratory (NPL), and funded by EPSRC with support from Denmark's Aarhus University.

Academic Centres of Excellence in Cyber Security Education award success

The Department of Computer Science has received the Academic Centres of Excellence in Cyber Security Education (ACEs-CSE) **Silver award** for the <u>MSc Cyber Security</u> programme and <u>research</u> in recognition of their excellence in cyber security education.

The MSc course was the first in Wales to be fully and completely certified by the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) and Swansea University is now listed on the NCSC web pages as one of 14 UK universities with an ACE-CSE award.
