5 Quirky British Traditions:

- Rolling taking place every year in Cheese Gloucestershire, England, the event involves rolling a wheel of cheese down a steep hill, while participants chase after it.
- Jack in the Green "Jack" covered with leaves and looking like a moving hedge can be seen walking the streets of Hastings to celebrate May Day.
- Tar Barrel Racing on Bonfire Night, 5th November, the local men, women and children of Devon, carry fullsized lit tar barrels through the streets! The organisers believe its origins can be traced back to the gunpowder plot of 1605.
- Wife Carrying Race pairs of people, which don't have to strictly be women or wives, are carried over 380 meters over obstacles including hay bales and water.
- Gurning Competition at Egremont Crab Fair a competition that has been taking place in England for over 700 years. The competition involves contestants pulling grotesque faces, known as "gurns" while looking through a horse collar.
