

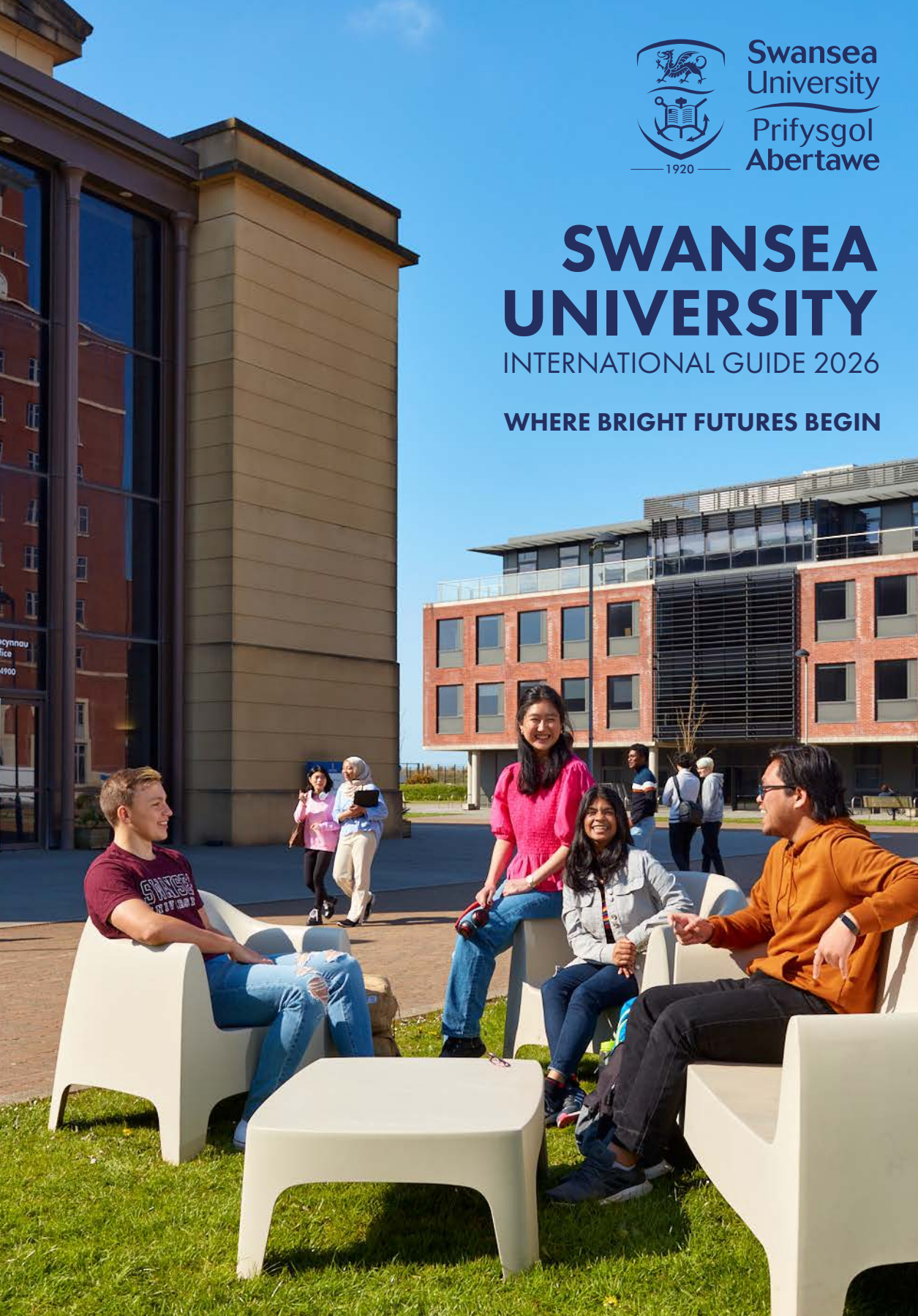

Swansea University is located on Swansea Bay; a beautiful five-mile stretch of beach that is easily accessible from both campuses.



ENDLESS ADVENTURE

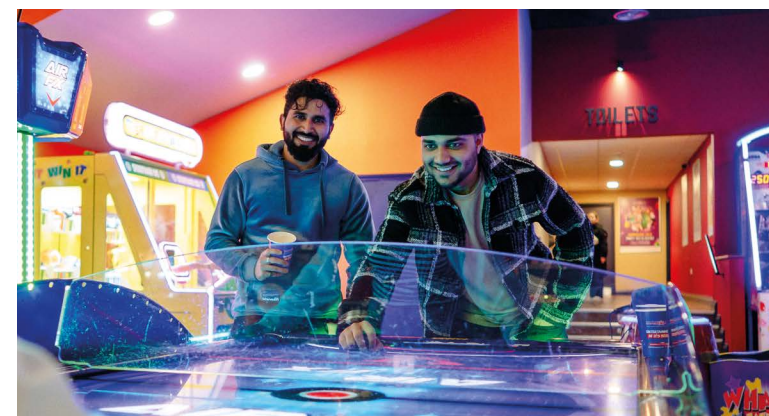
We have the Gower Peninsula on our doorstep (an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty). The Gower has over 20 beaches to choose from, meaning you'll have plenty of opportunities to learn to surf, paddleboard or kayak.

If you prefer dry land, there's also a six-mile beachfront path that passes right outside Singleton Park Campus, perfect for using our Swansea University Cycles or going for a relaxing walk.

A LOW COST OF LIVING

The cost of rent, food and entertainment in Swansea is lower than it is in many larger UK cities*, so you may find that your budget stretches further due to the lower cost of living.

*Rent in Swansea is on average 64% lower than London and on average 17.6% lower than Cardiff (numbeo.com/cost-of-living/in/Swansea).

CULTURE AND THE ARTS

Swansea is a vibrant centre for art, with the Glynn Vivian Art Gallery recognised as the city's main venue. All national museums and art galleries in Wales are free to enter, so you can learn all about Welsh history and culture at your leisure, or you can join one of the many trips organised by our Students' Union.

THE TALIESIN ARTS CENTRE

The Taliesin Arts Centre is at the heart of Singleton Park Campus and hosts regular performances, shows, comedians and cinema screenings. The building is also home to the award-winning Egypt Centre and its collection of over 5,000 artefacts.



MUSIC, FESTIVALS AND MAJOR EVENTS

Wales is famous for being the 'land of song'. As a student here, you won't be disappointed by the variety of music available across the city, from intimate live music venues to the Swansea Building Society Arena, which hosts international stars.

The area also attracts a variety of major events throughout the year, including the IronMan 70.3 race, the Swansea Bay Air Show, often attended by the Red Arrows (one of the World's best aerobatic display teams), and the Swansea Bay 10km and Half Marathon races, which all bring a vibrant atmosphere to the city.

SHOPPING

In Swansea you can shop major high street brands in the city, independent boutiques in Mumbles, vintage clothing in the Uplands, or you can even explore Wales' biggest indoor market, which is full of stalls where you can pick up a tasty treat!

The city by the sea has a poetry all of its own. Swansea's most famous son, Dylan Thomas said: "Swansea is still the best" and the poet's legacy is found throughout the city from cafes and pubs to parks.

We have accommodation to suit you, whatever your needs.

BAY CAMPUS

Bay Campus, known for its state-of-the-art facilities, beach, and seafront promenade, is popular with first-year, returning, and postgraduate students. It offers modern accommodation with easy access to academic buildings and vibrant social spaces.

SINGLETON PARK CAMPUS

Singleton Park Campus, close to lectures, Swansea Bay Sports Park, and Singleton Hospital, is popular with first-year, international, medical, and postgraduate students.

Whether you choose Bay's beachfront lifestyle or Singleton's academic hub, both campuses offer a diverse range of options to suit all needs, which include: accessible or adapted rooms, quiet accommodation, single-sex, alcohol free, mature or postgraduate, and non-standard course length. Accommodation includes en-suite, standard, and adapted rooms with shared kitchens and some options with a catering allowance.

BECK HOUSE

Beck House is a small and friendly site, popular among mature students, healthcare science, medical students, international students, families, and couples. The Uplands area offers a vibrant community with shops, bars, cafes and restaurants, all within walking distance. Frequent bus services provide easy access to both Singleton Park and Bay Campuses, as well as the city centre.

ACCOMMODATION TIMELINE

NOVEMBER

Applications open for new and returning students. If you have an offer from us, you can make an application as soon as you receive your student number from the Admissions team.

JUNE

Guaranteed accommodation closes on the 30th June. Accommodation applications remain open after this date, so please continue to apply online.

Summer accommodation is available for bookings of one week or more, offering a flexible option for students who wish to stay in Swansea over the summer. This is ideal for those attending summer schools, internships, or simply looking to enjoy the city during the warmer months.

SEPTEMBER

Offers of accommodation are sent upon receipt to unconditional offer holders. Conditional offer holders can expect to receive a room offer after satisfying these conditions to study.

JANUARY ENTRY

Guaranteed accommodation if you apply by 1 December.

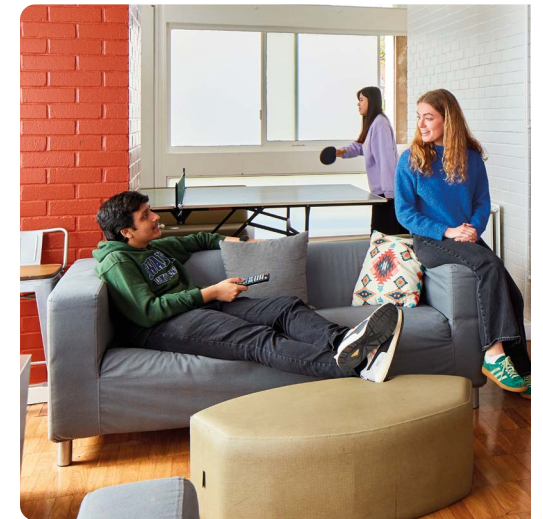
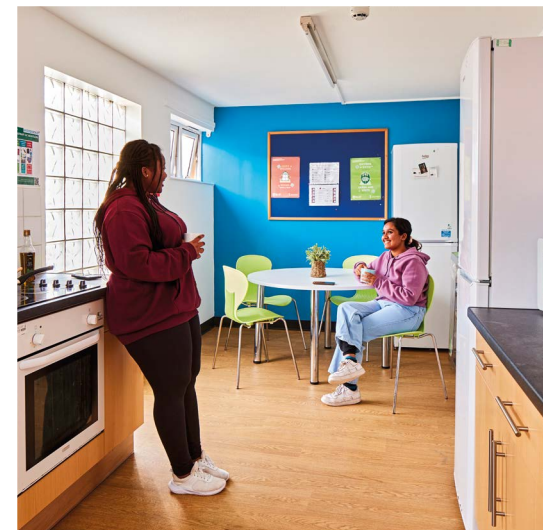
UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Contract lengths will match the duration of your studies. For many undergraduate students, this will be for One Semester, from January to July.

POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS

Students will receive an accommodation contract for the period January to September, and will then be required to submit a new application for the period from September onwards. Unfortunately, we cannot offer one contract for the full January to December period.

Our accommodation team are on hand to support you with your application and finding the right residence.

FAQS AND KEY FACTS

IF I APPLY FOR UNIVERSITY ACCOMMODATION AM I GUARANTEED A ROOM?

Yes, as long as you apply for accommodation by 30th June (or 1st December for January entry) and fulfil the requirements of your academic offer from the University. We recommend that you apply quickly as allocations work on a first come first served basis. However, we do not guarantee that you will be allocated your first choice of room.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T PAY MY ACCOMMODATION DEPOSIT BEFORE I ARRIVE? WILL I STILL HAVE MY ROOM?

If you don't pay your Advance Rent Payment your room will be cancelled and you will not have accommodation when you arrive.

CAN I BOOK A ROOM WHEN I ARRIVE IN SWANSEA?

No. We recommend you apply as soon as you can but at least 7 days prior to arrival. If you arrive on campus without making a booking, you will need to check into a hotel or alternative temporary accommodation, as we may not have a room available or ready for your arrival.

CAN I REQUEST A SPECIFIC RESIDENCE?

Yes, you can share your preferences in the 'Notes' section of the application form. While we cannot guarantee your request, we will do our best to accommodate your preferences.

HOW ARE ROOMS ALLOCATED? WILL I BE LIVING WITH STUDENTS ON THE SAME COURSE?

There will be a mixture of students from various countries living together and studying on different courses. However, we will take into consideration the age of students when allocating rooms.

CAN I REQUEST ALCOHOL FREE, QUIET, OR SAME SEX ACCOMMODATION?

Yes. This is available on request and you must specify on your application form if you would like to live in one of these areas.

It is essential that university or private accommodation is booked in advance to avoid any inconvenience on your arrival.

UNIVERSITY RESIDENCES

SINGLE STUDY ROOMS

The majority of our rooms are for single occupation only, however we also offer rooms for dual occupancy and family flats.

BEDDING

Bedding is not provided. You will need to provide your own bedding (duvet, blankets and pillows) and bed linen (sheets). These are available to buy at low cost from local shops and supermarkets. You can pre-order bedding, bathroom and kitchen packs, along with accessories, with UniKitOut. Deliveries will be waiting for you upon arrival at your accommodation, making your move as simple and straightforward as possible.

BATHROOMS

En-suite rooms have a toilet, wash basin and shower. A standard room involves sharing a toilet, shower with 1 or 2 other residents in the flat. All standard rooms have wash basins in the room.

Kitchens are fully equipped and have a table or seating area. You will need to provide your own cooking utensils and crockery. Visit our webpages for more information and to view online tours.

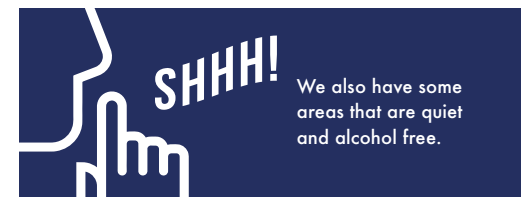

WORK WHILE YOU STUDY

Working in the UK can not only help you manage your finances but also provides you with a chance to enhance your skills, expand your network, and enrich your overall educational journey. Most student visas will allow a certain number of hours' work alongside your degree, normally 20hrs per week during term time and full-time during vacation periods (please check your visa for your exact personal allowance).

The biggest sectors employing students for part-time work in the UK are retail (shops and supermarkets), catering (bars and restaurants) and social care (care homes). Large employers will ask you to complete an online application form on their website, but many independent businesses hire individuals that pop into their venues in person with a CV.

FINDING GRADUATE WORK

Staying in the UK to work is an aspiration for many international students. The process of finding this work can be long and unfamiliar, but employers are looking for new ways to find the talent they need to grow their businesses. So don't worry, we have plenty of tips for you to enter this competitive market!

And remember, our expert Careers Advisors are here to support you with lifelong careers advice and guidance throughout your studies, and post-graduation, through our Graduate Support Programme.

ROUTES AND VISAS

Good knowledge of your visa and potential routes will empower you to have effective conversations with future employers. Many hiring managers have experience of hiring internationally, but others will be relying on your knowledge of the UK immigration system. Most individuals will have two options: skilled worker visa and graduate visa (also called post study work visa). See our short guide to understand the differences between them.

The Swansea University English Language Test (*SWELT) is the official English language test for international students wishing to study at Swansea University who are looking for an alternative to IELTS.

Swansea University is a Licenced Sponsor of the Points Based Immigration System and therefore accepts SWELT as an alternative to IELTS for entry to undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.

SWELT is ideal if you have an offer to study at Swansea University and are looking for an alternative to IELTS to fulfil your English language entry requirement.

Study OPTIONS

There are many ways to study at Swansea University.

FULL DEGREE

Most students will choose to study their full degree with us, choosing from one of our undergraduate or postgraduate programmes. Swansea's average A level entry tariff for undergraduate programmes is AAA (360 UCAS tariff points) to CCD (220 UCAS tariff points).

MASTER'S DEGREE

Taught postgraduate courses (MA, MSc, LLM) normally require the equivalent of a UK lower second class honours degree (2:2) from a recognised institution.

RESEARCH DEGREE

Research courses (MRes, MPhil, PhD) normally require the equivalent of a UK upper second class level honours degree (2:1) from a recognised institution, and will often require an additional relevant master's degree.

If you do not meet the entry requirements for your chosen undergraduate or postgraduate degree, you might be able to study a foundation, international year one or pre-master's course with our pathway college which will bring you up to the required level. Details can be found on page 30.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

International applicants are expected to show a good level of English for entry into the UK and for our courses. English language requirements are stated on the individual course pages online. In most cases, we require an IELTS 6.0, or equivalent, for undergraduate entry and IELTS 6.5, or

AND FUNDING

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT DEPOSIT

If you are an international or EU student who requires a student visa, you will need to pay your deposit to us before we can issue your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), which you will need to complete your visa application. The deposit amount will vary depending on your country of origin.

For most international students, the deposit amount is £4000, with the exception of:

- Applicants from certain states of India, who are required to pay their first year tuition fee in full (minus any bursary or scholarship confirmed at the CAS stage).
- Applicants from Afghanistan, who are required to pay their first year tuition fee in full (minus any bursary or scholarship confirmed at the CAS stage).
- Applicants from Bangladesh, Ghana and Pakistan, who are required to pay 50% of their first year tuition fee as a deposit.

COST OF LIVING

The cost of living in Swansea is relatively low compared to many other cities in the UK. However, it is still vital that you prepare your finances before you attend university. The average Swansea University student will spend between £7,000 and £11,000 per year.

The UKVI sets living costs at a minimum of £1,023 per month for student visa purposes (over 52 weeks), depending on lifestyle choices.

WORKING WHILST STUDYING

Your ability to work in the UK will depend on your nationality and type of immigration pathway.

If you are a full-time student on a student visa, you can work up to either 10 or 20 hours a week (depending on your course). For most undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD students the limit would be 20 hours. If you are planning on studying on a different visa (e.g. Short-term Study Visa, Dependant, Skilled Worker) you may be able to work. It is important that you check the guidance for your individual pathway.

Any government guidelines that cover the number of hours that you can work will also consider the intensity of your course. We advise that you speak with your Academic College or School before taking on part-time work.

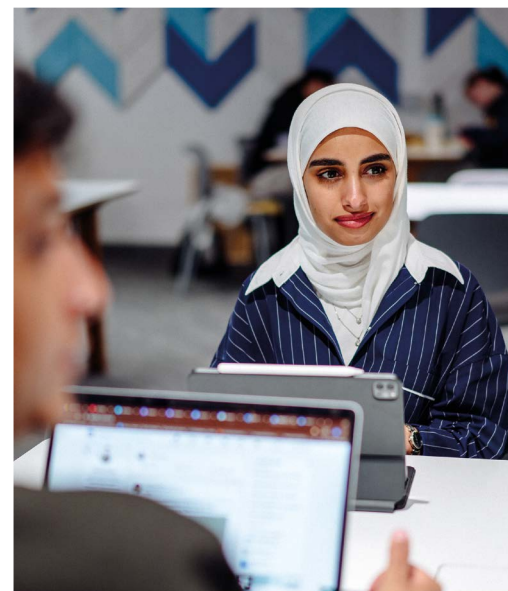

INTERVIEWS

The majority of programmes do not require an interview as part of the selection process. If an interview is required, the purpose and format will be communicated to you, so you know what to expect, and what role this plays in the overall selection process.

Enrolment for taught programmes usually takes place in early September for September entry, and early January for January entry.
